Activity Idea: Lego-Club at Home



Many children will be familiar with school Lego Groups to help build positive social and communication skills, and these can be simplified to try at home too as a 1:1 activity with your child.

One of you holds all the pieces (the Builder), and the other holds the instructions and describes the pieces that are needed and where they go to build a model (the Engineer).

You can take-turns as you go along, so see how long it takes you – it's trickier than it sounds so start with something small!
